- 4. Look up the following verses and prayerfully reflect on the features of the church: Matt 16:18; 18:17-20; Acts 20:28; Eph 3:8-11, 20-21; 5:22-33; 1 Tim 3:15; Heb 10:24-25
- 5. In what context were these features best applied and demonstrated in the NT?
- 6. Assuming you want to love what Christ loves and commit to what Christ is committed to:
 - a. what is the love and commitment Christ has shown the church and
 - b. how does this match up with your love and commitment to the church?
- 7. How would you respond to someone who claims to be a believer but doesn't think it's necessary to go to church?
- 8. Respond in prayer and praise as you reflect upon God calling you out of slavery to sin and into His community (the church)
- 9. Spend time this week praying for Grace Bible Church e.g. the people in our congregation, the leadership, the different ministries, opportunities for evangelism, spiritual growth, our purity, and unity.
