A Reason for Our prayers (v. 2b)	6. Paul isn't instructing us to pray for a peaceful life in v. 2, but that one reason for praying (especially for those in authority), is so we may have a greater opportunity to witness to those around us, as they recognize we aren't hostile toward them, but want what's best for them. We are also to live out our witness "in all godliness and dignity." How does this challenge and encourage you to think		

dignity." How does this challenge and encourage you to think, speak, and act toward unbelievers (especially in government?) In what ways could you strive to live this out this week?
