Application of 1 Tim 3:2

- 1. Is it reasonable to understand these qualifications for an overseer as general qualities that are ideal for all Christians? Why/why not?
- 2. Are these suggested qualifications and Paul's personal opinion for selecting the best candidates for eldership OR a requirement? How does this impact the process of recognizing and affirming those God has chosen to serve as elders in His church?
- 3. What does it mean to be "above reproach"? Why is this likely to be the overarching characteristic of an overseeing and explained with the following qualifications?
 - a. Why is it important all Christians strive to be "above reproach"?
- 4. What does "husband of one wife" mean? Why are other views missing Paul's point?
 - a. Ask God to reveal sexual sin in your life, repent, and if needed seek counsel or accountability
 - b. What standard of sexual conduct do you allow in forms of entertainment you participate in and allow your children to watch/hear (including LGTBQ, nudity, boy/girl relationships)?
 - c. Is your marriage a reflection of the Gospel (i.e. the relationship between Christ and His Church)? Do you love your spouse? Do you regularly give yourself in intimacy?
- 5. The words "temperate," "sensible," and "respectable" refer to not being controlled by passions, emotions, or temporary satisfaction, but clear thinking, self-restrained, level-headed and thus deserving and receiving respect and admiration.
 - a. What's one desire or excessiveness in your life you recognize needs growth in self-control e.g. food, entertainment,
 - b. What's one area of your thought-life you recognize needs growth e.g. decision making, controlling ungodly thoughts?
