Application of 1 Timothy 3:11-13

- 1. What are some of the arguments for the different translations, "wives" or "women?" What view do you believe is best and why?
- 2. How does (or will) thinking about the interpretation of "women" in v. 11 benefit and grow your interpretation of Scripture?
- 3. No matter how the subject of this verse is translated, all believers are called to be "dignified, not malicious gossips, but temperate, faithful in all things" ...
 - a. What do each of these requirements mean?
 - b. Of these four, which one is the Lord prompting you to grow in the most and how can you apply this in your life?
- 4. Also, no matter how the subject of v. 11 is translated, women obviously played a large role in the ministry of the church. Take time to consider the role of women in the church in the NT.
 - a. How does this help shape your view of women serving in the church today?
 - b. Take time to thank a woman for their service this week.
- 5. Ask the Lord to bring to your mind any areas of your life that are not sexually pure. Ask His forgiveness and help to seek to "flee from sexual immorality."
- 6. Although deacons are required to be good managers/leaders of their household, all Christians are called to the same. Evaluate your leadership/management in the home and choose one way you can improve in this (this might be a good couple exercise).
- 7. For those who serve the Lord faithfully there are rewards.
 - a. How might serving in the church give someone a greater reputation in the church and community?
 - b. How might faithfully serving in the church increase someone's confidence in their faith in Christ?
