## **Application of 1 Timothy 5:5-8**

- 1. The description of the "widow indeed" presents a woman who has set her hope on God, throughout her life (not just her widowhood)
  - a. Consider what Scripture teaches us about 'fixing our hope on God' (e.g. 1 Tim 1:1; 4:10; 6:17; Ps 27:14; 39:7; 71:5; Jer 17:7)
  - b. Is your hope 'fixed on God'? Are there situations in your life right now that you need to fix your hope on God?
- 2. The description of the "widow indeed" presents a woman who is continually in prayer, but again this is to be characteristic of all God's people (see Luke 18:1-8; Eph 6:18; 1 Thess 5:17)
- 3. Compare the difference between the destitute, poor, praying woman and the self-indulgent, materialistic woman.
  - a. How does this comparison reveal God's perspective on what it means to be alive?
  - b. How does this also challenge you in your perspective/actions?
  - c. How do vv. 5-6 (and the whole passage of vv. 3-16) provide guidance for who the church is to help and safeguard the church from "enabling" people?
- 4. Why might a grieving, wounded, lonely person be vulnerable to seek comfort and pleasure rather than submit to and trust God?
- 5. How does practicing the instructions given in this passage (vv. 3-6) lead to people being "above reproach"? Why is this important?
- 6. Who would be considered within the circle of your "own" and who would be part of the smaller circle of your "household"?
  - a. Specifically consider how you may care for your aging parents, whether they may need practical care now or will in the future.
  - b. How can you plan ahead (e.g. financially, your home) to honour your parents well?
- 7. Reflect on the forceful and somewhat shocking words Paul uses to describe family members who don't care for their needy family members, how does this challenge you?
