## **Application of 1 Timothy 5:19-21**

- 1. Why might elders be more susceptible to false accusations and gossip than other Christians?
- 2. Are you guilty of believing or sharing unfounded and unsubstantiated accusations or stories against an elder(s) or even other people (if so, ask God to forgive you)?
  - a. Commit to apply biblical wisdom in making judgements about others (see Deut 19:15-20; Prov 18:5, 13, 17; Zech 8:16; 1 Cor 13:7)
- 3. What wisdom lays behind the requirement for an elder (and others e.g. Deut 19:15-20; Matt 18:15-20) to be accused of sin by 2+ witnesses?
  - a. In what situations may an investigation into an accusation need to follow a different approach (i.e. if there aren't 2+ witnesses)?
- 4. What is the stated purpose in v. 20 of discipline against an elder? How would this be effective in the lives of other elders (and all believers)?
  - a. What other reasons might exist for why a sinning elder should be rebuked "in the presence of all" the congregation?
- 5. Do you go about your daily tasks and decision making with a sense of the "presence of God and of Christ Jesus and of His elect angels"?
- 6. Why do you think Paul went to such great lengths to build up the solemn nature of his charge? What does this suggest about the powerful inclination toward partiality?
- 7. In what way(s) might you be tempted toward bias and partiality?
- Consider other relevant passages on church discipline and notice the similarities and differences in the process and practice of this important aspect of the church (see Matt 18:15-20; 1 Cor 5; 2 Cor 2:5-11; Gal 6:1-5; 2 Thess 3:6-15; Titus 1:10-13; 3:10-11)

  - a. What's the goal of church discipline?
- 9. How does v. 19 refer to honouring elders and how do vv. 20-21 refer to honouring the office/position of eldership?
