# Application of 1 Timothy 6:6-10

- What's the relationship between godliness and contentment?
  a. Can someone be godly without being content and can they truly be content without being godly?
- 2. Has discontentment robbed you of joy, gratitude, peace, and generosity? What are some of the other signs of discontentment?
- 3. How does understanding our estate in the beginning and end of life impact how we live in between? See also Job 1:21; Eccl 5:15-16; Ps 49:17; Luke 12:20-21.
- 4. Paul's reference to "food and covering" is a general statement regarding the necessities of life. What would you include on a list of "necessities"?
  - a. How would you feel about only having "food and covering" (i.e. the necessities)? What might this reveal about your heart?
- 5. Where is true contentment found (e.g. Phil 4:10-13)? How can you grow in godly contentment?
- 6. Consider some other warnings in the NT regarding the desire for or love of money (e.g. Matt 6:19-34; Luke 12:15-21; 16:14-15; 18:18-27; James 1:10-11; 5:3-5; Rev 3:17-18) and ask God to search your heart for sinful attitudes or practices related to money.
- 7. In what ways does a desire to be rich open up the door of temptation that can quickly lead to the devil's snare and many other foolish and harmful desires, which end in eternal destruction?
- 8. Does Paul say it's wrong to be rich? Why or why not?
- What are signs of loving money? Do you need to repent from such love?
  a. What action steps might you take to protect yourself from the evil pursuit of money?
- 10. If your time, your phone, your bank accounts could talk, would they testify of your love for God or for money?
