Application of 1 Timothy 6:15b-16

- 1. How does a person's view of God impact every aspect of their life? What does your life reveal about your view of God?
- 2. What's the significance of God being the "**only** Sovereign"? Consider this truth of God as it relates to His sovereignty over all earthly/human rulers and all heavenly/spiritual rulers.
- 3. How should you live toward God because He is over all as "King of kings and Lord of lords"?
- 4. What does Paul mean when he says God "**alone** has immortality" and what does he imply about our hope of eternal life?
- 5. In what way is God inaccessible and invisible? Why aren't we able to approach Him?
- 6. In what way does the greatness of God prompt you to humility, awe, adoration, love, and obedience as you consider His saving work through Jesus Christ to bring you to Himself and welcome you as His child who will be with Him for eternity?
- 7. What's your attitude in approaching God, both on a Sunday at church and personally throughout the week?
- 8. Meditate on a particular attribute of God from this passage and use other Scripture references to further deepen your understanding of who God is.
- 9. How does reflecting on the greatness of God motivate you to "keep the commandment" until Christ's return (v. 14)?
- 10. Take some time to reflect on the greatness of God and respond in thanks and praise.
