Application of the Message for Evangelism

1. How does correctly understanding who God is, who man is, and who Christ is (the three other aspects of the Gospel message we've looked at in previous sermons) lead one to a biblical understanding of a sinner's necessary response to the Gospel message?
 - a. How does misunderstanding these three elements of the Gospel negatively influence someone's view on a sinner's response?
2. In the NT, what are sinners called to do in response to the Gospel?
 - a. What other calls to respond have you heard about or witnessed and why are these lacking truth and power?
3. What does "repent" mean? Where does repentance come from?
4. What's the difference between godly sorrow and worldly sorrow (see 2 Cor 7:9-11)?
 - a. Is your response to sin godly or worldly sorrow?
 - b. Ask God to grant you genuine repentance for your sin.
 - c. Is there a specific sin(s) God has convicted you of that you need to genuinely repent of (including making wrongs right and asking others for forgiveness)?
 - i. If so, repent of your sin and bear fruit of your repentance through any actions you need to take.
 - ii. If you need to confess your sin to another person and ask them to pray for you (James 5:16) please do that!
5. What does the word "believe" mean when a sinner is called to "believe" in Christ?
6. What is the object of belief? What are we trusting in?
7. Thank God for gifting you with repentance & faith, so that you've turned from your sin and trusted in Christ as Lord and Saviour.
8. Ask God to give you an opportunity to call a sinner to respond to the Gospel of Christ in repentance and faith!
