## **Application of Matt 5:1-2**

  - a. How does Matt 1-4 establish who Jesus is and prepare us for His teaching?
- 3. What's the historical and physical setting of this message (see 5:1-2; 7:28-8:1)?
- 4. Who was Jesus speaking to (indirectly and directly) and how's that relevant for you today?
  - a. What's the relevant application for His 'indirect' audience today?
  - b. What's the relevant application for His 'direct' audience today?
- 5. Why can't unbelievers live out the core of this message (5:3-7:12)?
- 6. How do Jesus' words express His authority?
  - What phrase does He repeat?
  - What positive and negative commands does His give?
  - What will His role be on judgement day?
  - What illustration does He provide?
- 7. Ask God for a heart 'to come to Him' ready to learn and apply.
- 8. How has this introductory sermon encouraged and challenged you as we prepare to study the greatest sermon ever preached by the greatest preacher ever?
