Application of Matthew 5:6

- 1. What do the words "hunger and thirst" mean and how does the experience of these words in even a small physical sense, help you understand a believer is to crave for righteousness?
- 2. How could you use physical hunger and thirst to remind you of this beatitude and lead you to prayer?
- 3. What does the word "righteousness" mean in this context (i.e. imputed righteousness through Christ or right living before God)?
- 4. What are some examples in Scripture and history of people who craved for righteousness? (see Ps 42:1-2; 119:34, 44, 51, 60, 100, 101, 131, 145, 157, 167; John 4:34; 5:30; 17:4; Matt 26:39)
 - a. Do you want to be like them?
 - b. Are you prepared to suffer the consequences of such a craving like many of them did (see also Matt 5:10-12)?
- 5. How does reading, listening to, studying, meditating, and memorizing Scripture increase your desire and help you live God's way?
- 6. What is hindering you from an increased hunger and thirst for righteousness (both sin and the excessive or unnecessary use of good things)?
 - a. What do you need to put off or stop doing and what do you need to put on and start doing instead?
- 7. Spiritual hunger and thirst doesn't come naturally or from ourselves, but God... so pray for God to increase your hunger and thirst to obey Him.
 - a. Note: The answer to your prayer will come through your actions, we don't crave for God by sitting in the gutter of life or on the couch of laziness.
- 8. Reflect on verses describing God as the source of our satisfaction (these aren't all specifically related to spiritual satisfaction) e.g. Ps 107:9; 34:10; 23:1, 5; Jer 31:14, 25; Luke 1:35; John 4:14; 6:35
- 9. What will you start doing today to grow in your desire for righteousness?
