Application of Matthew 5:10-12

- 1. Why might persecution be the natural result of a person 'being' the disciple Jesus described in the previous 7 beatitudes?
- 2. What is persecution? What are general categories of persecution from our text?
- 3. What's the difference between being persecuted for doing what is right and for Christ than suffering for your foolishness or any other reason? See also 1 Pet 4:14-16
 - a. How can you grow in godliness so you don't suffer for your foolish or sinful actions, but for the sake of Christ and righteousness?
- 4. Who are some examples of people in Scripture, church history (and possibly people in your own life) who've experienced persecution and how can you follow their example?
- 5. Consider the promise Jesus gives to the persecuted of their inheritance in the kingdom of heaven (v. 10), how does this comfort and motivate you to live for Christ?
- 6. Consider the promise of a great reward in heaven (v. 12), how does this motivate you to live for Christ and even rejoice in persecution?
 - a. Reflect on other passages in Scripture referring to eternal glory/rewards e.g. Matt 6:1–18; 10:41–42; Rom 8:18; 1 Cor 3:10-15; 2 Cor 4:17-18; 5:10-11; 2 Tim 4:8
- 7. How do (or should) Jesus' words change your view on persecution?
 - a. Think about the example of the Apostles in Acts 5:40-41 and how they rejoiced after excruciating torture (see also 1 Pet 1:3-9; 4:12-16)
 - b. Ask God to give you His perspective of persecution such that you'll respond with joy and gladness (v. 12).
- 8. Reflect on the sobering reality that persecution isn't something we can (or should try to) avoid (e.g. John 15:18-21; 2 Tim 3:12) and surrender any fears to the Lord as you seek to live for Him, even under the threat of possible persecution.
- 9. Pray for the persecuted church this week based on Jesus' words.

Reading this week: Read Matt 5:3-16 each day this week.
